Completed applications should be received in the Senate Office by March 12, 2011.

Preference for Graduating Year Scholarships will be given to students in full-time graduate study unless the Terms of reference for a particular scholarship explicitly state otherwise.

STUDENTS WHO RECEIVE A GRADUATE AWARD MUST PROVIDE A COPY OF THEIR REGISTRATION FORM FOR GRADUATE STUDIES BEFORE A CHEQUE WILL BE ISSUED FROM BRANDON UNIVERSITY.

<u>Dr. Peter Letkeman Endowed Scholarship in Chemistry</u> -To be awarded to a Chemistry major who is proceeding to graduate school
Brandon University Alumni Association Graduate Scholarship -Awarded to a graduating student of academic distinction who proceeds directly to full-time studies in graduate or professional studies at an approved institution. Eligible students must have participated in extra-curricular activities during their undergraduate years, in the University or wider community, and provide two Letters of Reference regarding such activities
Arthur & Abbie Vining Memorial Graduate Scholarships -Provided by a bequest in the will of Abbie Helmer Vining. The awards are in memory of Arthur W. Vining, Professor of Mathematics & Physics in the early years of Brandon College. They are to be awarded to graduating students of academic distinction in either Mathematics or Physics who are continuing studies in either field
Arthur & Abbie Vining Memorial Graduate Scholarships -Provided by a bequest in the will of Abbie Helmer Vining. To be awarded to graduating students of academic distinction in the General or the Applied Music program OR to an earlier graduate in Music Education. To receive the awards, the applicants must have been accepted into a recognized program of graduate studies. The awards are in memory of Abbie H. Vining, first Director of the Music Program of Brandon College
Dr. Ralph F.B. King Graduate Scholarship in English -This scholarship is established to encourage the study of English literature at the graduate level. It is awarded upon recommendation of the English Department to a graduating student with a major in English who has been accepted into graduate studies in English literature at an accredited institution, and who has achieved the highest academic standing with a minimum of a "B+" average in all English

Christopher Riley Memorial Graduate Scholarship in Geology
-To be awarded to a student(s) who is (are) graduating with a Four-Year Honours Degree in Geology with a grade point average of at least 3.50 in those Geology courses required for the degree, plus an overall grade point average of 3.0, and who has (have) been accepted into a graduate program in Geology at a recognized University, during the year of graduation. The award will be divided among
eligible candidates each year. \$1241
Dr. Mieczyslaw Kozakiewicz and Marian Thomas Kozakiewicz Scholarship -To be awarded, normally on a rotating basis, to a student in one of the following programs of study: a) a student at Brandon University who has been accepted into a graduate program in environmental studies at any Canadian University; b) a Brandon University student who has been accepted into first year Medicine at any Canadian University; c) a student purs uing a Bachelor of Science in Nursing at Brandon University; d) a 3 rd year student proceeding to the fourth year in History at Brandon University. This scholarship will be awarded on the basis of academic excellence by application. \$1200
Dr. Duprat Scholarship in Dentistry -To be awarded on the basis of academic merit to a Brandon University student in his/her graduating year who has been accepted into a Doctor of Dentistry program in Canada. If no graduating student is eligible in any given year, then the award may be renewable for the Brandon University graduate student who most recently received the award given that they continue to meet all admission requirements for the Doctor of Dentistry program at their institution
G.F. MacDowell Graduate Scholarship in Psychology -To be awarded to a student graduating with a major in Psychology who is proceeding to a graduate program in Psychology. Selection will be based on the candidate's academic record and contributions to academic and student activities in the Department of Psychology
Richard H. Patmore Memorial Scholarship in Political Economics -To be awarded upon the recommendation of the Economics Department, to a Brandon University Economics student who is progressing in the study of economics and/or political economy and who has a demonstrated interest in seeking solutions to important social problems. In the event that for a particular year or series of years, the Economics Department cannot recommend a recipient for this award, it may be made in subsequent years
Dr. D. K. Chaudhari Memorial Bursary -Funded by friends and family to honor Dr. Chaudhari for his interest in medical education. Awarded on the basis of need and merit to a student who has successfully completed Third Year of pre-medical studies, who has fulfilled requirements for a degree. Student must provide the Scholarship Office with a confirmation of acceptance into medical school
Western Manitoba Bar Association Scholarship in Pre-Law -To be awarded to a graduating student who has completed the Law School Admissions Test (LSAT) and has been accepted into an accredited Canadian Faculty of Law. The applicant's academic record and record of community service will receive equal consideration. Preference will be given to a student from Western Manitoba or with community ties to the region. Two letters of reference must be submitted to the Senate Office. (May not be shared)

Alexandra Doreen Fedoruk Sym Memorial Scholarship -Is provided by Nelda Fedoruk Sym and the late Alexander Fedoruk in memory of their daughter Doreen. It is to be awarded annually to a student who has completed a minimum of one year of studies (24-36 credit hours) at Brandon University, and who has been accepted into a Social Work program at an accredited institution

Fotina Pappas Memorial Award -To be awarded on the basis of academic merit and financial need to a Brandon University student in his/her graduating year who has been accepted into a Doctor of Dentistry program in Canada. This award may not be shared
Dr. Barbara Mackalski Scholarship in Pre-Medicine -To be awarded to the graduating student with the highest standing who is accepted into a Canadian Medical School. In the event of a tie, preference will be given to either the student who is proceeding to the Faculty of Medicine at the University of Manitoba or the student from rural Manitoba\$TBA
Peter D. & Una B. Cameron Memorial Scholarship -Awarded on the basis of academic record and professional or graduate work in an approved institution. Whenever feasible, the award should be alternated between Arts, Science, Education, Music

Some awards, usually titled scholarships, are awarded on the basis of academic achievement and such other criteria as may be specified in the terms of reference for the award. Financial need is not considered in making such awards. Other awards, usually but not always designated as bursaries, specify that the student receiving the award must have a financial need in addition to meeting any other criteria specified in the terms of reference for the award. Where more than one applicant meets the financial need and other criteria, academic achievement may be a determining factor in making the award. Yet a third category of awards contain terms of reference that specify both academic achievement and financial need. What this all comes down to is that any award that mentions financial need as one of the terms requires that the applicant demonstrate that he or she has a financial need.

In defining financial need, we are required to follow certain general principles as specified by the Province of Manitoba, as the Province provides a portion of the funding for many awards. First priority will be given to students who will be receiving Manitoba Student Financial Aid (a student loan) as per item number 1, below. For any particular award, if there are no applicants who qualify under item number 1, consideration may be given to applicants who can truthfully attest that item number 2 applies to them.
