Newcomer Integration through Community Engagement in Brandon, Manitoba

MEET THE PRIOJECT PARTNERS

The Rural Development Institute (RDI) is a research centre at Brandon University that conducts community-based research projects, focusing on a variety of topics. This summer, RDI is collaborating on a participatory action project with the <u>Brandon Local Immigration Partnership</u> (BLIP) - a program of the <u>Brandon Neighborhood Renewal Corporation</u> (BNRC). Among their many initiatives, BLIP assists community-based partners who seek to support residents and newcomers access their personal needs.

THE PROJECT

This year, Dr. Wayne Kelly, Shirlyn Kunaratnam and Felix Ntenhene will be collaborating with BLIP Coordinator - Katrina Casulla - to identify gaps in current services for newcomers in Brandon, Manitoba. The project has been designed with a participatory action lens, where newcomers will be actively involved. The research team will be organizing focus group conversations with immigrants and newcomers to evaluate if the current suite of initiatives and partnership programming offered by BLIP are effectively addressing challenges and needs. Following the focus group conversations, the research team will also have discussions with service organizations serving in Brandon to share the information gathered. As part of this research, partners at BLIP will develop a data portal with the help of the research team to ensure that all the immigration and newcomer related information is accessible in one digital location.

OUTCOMES

This project aims to create a more inclusive, supportive, and thriving environment for all residents. By voices prioritizing the newcomers and immigrants, this project the may support development of targeted intervention that facilitate better integration, ultimately enhancing quality of life. contribution to decision-making may also empower participants, which is crucial for their successful integration into the community.
