Several Senators raised concerns with the Indigenous Curricular Content Committee's course approval process as the approval process is rigorous. Faculty members have noted they have had courses approved conditionally to meet the ICC requirement but are not able to move forward because the conditions are above the usual standards required for courses. The current approval process for the ICC requirement may be creating a barrier and may cross a line on academic freedom.

Senator Campbell stated he will relay the feedback to the committee.

Senator Kennedy stated he would relay the feedback to the committee and recommended consulting departments to determine which courses should be included in the requirement.
